## Deputy Principal's Address

### **Year 10/11/12 Examinations**

Here are some exam tips for students:

- Take time to slow your breathing and relax when you first sit down in the exam room.
- Skim over the exam paper, underlining key words and instructions.
- Work out how long you have for each question or section.
- Watch out for the wording of the questions - you need to understand and address what the question is really asking.
- Answer the questions you find easiest first to build your confidence, then as they relax more move on to more difficult ones.
- Don't worry about how long others are taking but keep an eye on the clock to ensure you have enough time to answer the more difficult questions.
- Re-read answers if possible and make any changes that are necessary - correct spelling, check workings.

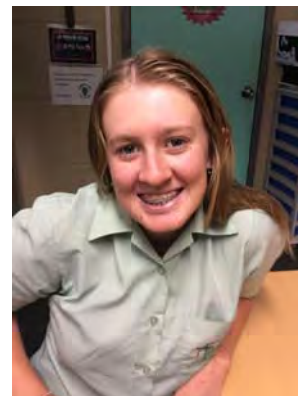
## Learning Area Updates

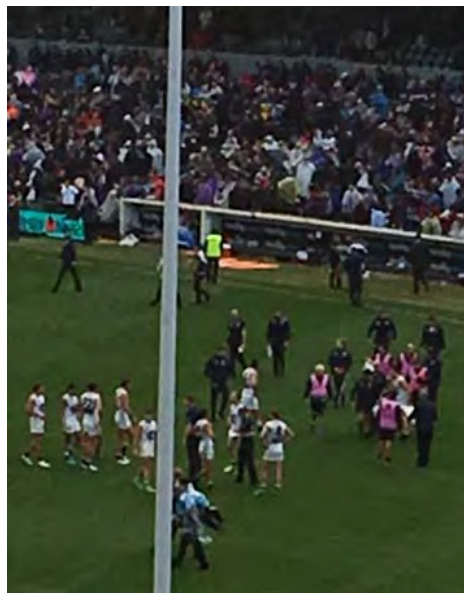
On Sunday he stayed with the team throughout the game day, and was on field during the game helping players, coaches and management.

### Beijing Bound - Beijing Youth Science Creation Competition

Aeroponics | The Future of Soilless Agriculture

As one of the 2016 SciTech/Rio Tinto Pilbara Beijing Bound winners, I travelled to the Beijing Youth Science Creation Competition in March this year. My project was on Aeroponics (The Future of Soilless Agriculture), and I met Josh Lyon, his mentor and the SciTech's coordinator Jessica Silva. When we reached Beijing, we were welcomed by cold, freezing winds and a rainy climate not experienced by any of us before.

I was very privileged, as well as Josh, for getting silver medals as we competed against over 150 international students. Being selected as one of only four international students to speak at the symposium, I was very honoured as this was a first for any Pilbara entrant. I presented to a full lecture hall, judges from Finland, America and the Head of Science fair from MIT.

We visited the Forbidden City, Tiananmen Square, and the Great Wall of China; making many lasting friendships. This journey was very emotional for all of us; meeting new people and saying goodbye to them in such a short span of time. It not only encouraged me to continue further research in the science field and learn about the world, but it also helped me experience the unbelievable ideas other young people have for science.

# National Bike Register

## How it works

The National Bike Register has been developed in partnership with Police, Crime Stoppers Australia and Data Dot Technology Ltd and allows owners to log information for FREE about their bicycles and bike parts onto a secure database.

Police are able to access the database to verify ownership and details of the bicycle, which can assist Police return property to the rightful owner or refute ownership claims by someone in possession of a stolen bicycle.

## What do I need to do?

- 1 Register your bike**  
Add your details on the National Bike Register
- 2 Mark & Protect**  
Mark your bike with your (or a family member's) driver's license number using a UV marker pen\* or other security marking kits
- 3 Apply Warning Label**  
Reduce your risk of theft by warning thieves that you use the National Bike Register by applying a tamper evident warning label\* to the seat post or seat tube.

# PROPERTY MARKING

Marking your property makes ownership clear, deters theft and assists police return property to its rightful owner.



## Step 1

### Create a special code

In WA we prefer that you mark your property using your driver's licence number.

For Example: WA1234567

If you don't have a WA driver's licence, you could use a relative's or close friend's details or use your passport number or Medicare number.

## Step 2

### Mark your property

It is best to mark your property near the serial number. If your property does not have a serial number the best place is the top right hand corner, on the back.

Please keep in mind that UV ink fades in time and will need to be reapplied, especially if kept in sunlight or handled regularly.

Some items that you should mark include:

- TV
- Camera
- Appliances
- Game Consoles
- Mobile Phones
- Tools

## Step 3

### Property Register

Also known as an inventory list, property registers are the perfect addition for property marking.

Lists are available on the Neighbourhood Watch website at [www.nhw.wa.gov.au](http://www.nhw.wa.gov.au) or create your own including: description; model number; serial number; value (\$AU).

This list should be kept in a safe (preferably fire proof) spot and copies should be sent to your insurance company.

For items that cannot be marked, such as jewellery, photographs should be taken and stored with your property register.

## Step 4

### Identify that your property is marked

Display property identification warning stickers in a prominent position on the front and rear entrances of homes warning all items have been marked for police identification.
